


A 3500 sq. ft. unit with six sterile rooms for inpatients stays and a

clinic for outpatients.

- Before the Burn Care Unit the chance of survival for severely burned patients was minimal, in 2004 the survival rate improved by almost 50%, now the survival rate has increased to 83%
- Patients being treated are suffering from 2nd & 3rd degree burns covering over 30% of their bodies.
- Has annually admitted about 75 severely burned patients.
- The number of patients the unit has treated is 1,320 since its opening.
- Burns are caused by electrical, open flame, or acid burns caused accidentally or otherwise.
- The unit is still the only one of its kind in the Caribbean.

Dear Supporters:

We are an elite team of volunteers who over the last 17 years have engaged in outreach programs empowering institutions and care providers to provide services that are not otherwise available. These programs span a wide range of areas in health care, poverty alleviation, basic education and mentoring.

In the process through the institutions that we serve, we have saved lives and improved the quality of life.

Our flagship project is the Burn Care Unit (BCU) which is a specialized critical care ward for severe burns patients within the Georgetown Public Hospital and was the first of its kind in the Caribbean. This was opened in 2002, is still fully functioning, and we continue supporting it on an ongoing basis, building its capacity to higher standards.

Our Mother & Child Nursing Education program was also first of its kind, where our accredited team of doctors and nurses delivered education to just over 300 nurses over the last 5 years, of which 125 successfully completed the Neonatal Resuscitation Program administered by the Canadian Pediatric Society and the another 75 participated in fetal surveillance.

We have cumulatively raised and disbursed just over \$1.5 million to fund these accomplishments, 97% was spent directly on outreach programs and the remaining 3% towards promotional publications. Out of the 20,000 volunteer hours, 60% was spent directing development programs and 40% spent soliciting technical expertise, promoting events and fundraising.

There were other initiatives along the way, and hopefully this booklet will give you a glimpse of the reach of our programs, both geographically and sectors.
